Q Where will the teachers be?

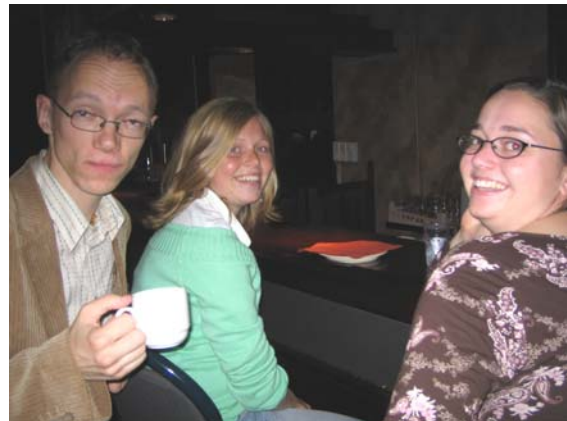
Martin: Just after the time of the newspaper-deadline they will be having a meeting in the pressroom. Which will be fine, because obviously you will make the deadline.
